The highlight of the week this week, was our visit to the Gurdwara. You can read more about this visit and see photos of the trip on our website news items on our **home page.** The children's behavior was immaculate throughout the visit and we are very proud of them. This week, Reception have started their new topic 'Growing and Changing' and have spent time reflecting on their favourite memories of Reception, these have included making new friends, maypole dancing and going on various school trips. In addition to our Gurdwara visit, Reception have also been learning more about the Sikh faith this week including important stories and the 5 Ks. Year 1's week started with a two hour Bikeability course. The children were coached in developing their accurate steering, instruction following and observational skills. They were awarded with a certificate at the end. The rest of their week has been story writing, counting forwards and backwards within 100, discovering lifecycles and learning their Maypole routine. This week year 2 have been very busy learning how to tell the time to quarter past and quarter to, they are slowly getting there but it can be a little tricky. They have also been looking at a few more Anthony Browne books and are looking forward to writing their own stories next week. They have also been writing some lovely summer poems that have really got us in the mood for summer. They have been busy practising their Maypole and are performing very professionally. They have really enjoyed looking at the new toilets in the cottage and can't wait to have their own toilets again! In KS1's topic lesson, the children learned how to sketch the cottage with pencil, wax crayon and soft pastels. They explored how each media works and how to create shape and texture. We discussed how artists embraced mistakes and used their artistic choice to inform their designs, rather than starting again or using a rubber to remove lines. These sketches will be displayed in the Dropmore Museum art gallery on Tuesday 12th July. Keep that date free!
