Autumn is well and truly here. Despite the wet and windy weather, we have managed to be outside every play and lunch time this week, so please ensure your child has a suitable coat in school every day, regardless of the forecast! This week Reception have enjoyed taking part in a range of listening activities and games, including exploring the sound of musical instruments, venturing outdoors on a listening walk and learning about rhyme. In Maths, the children have been busy sorting objects by their colour, shape and size; they were super stars at helping Miss Douglas sort out a rather large box of buttons. Well done Reception! Year 1 has had lots of fun with the story Not a Stick, learning to use adjectives to describe what a stick could be in imaginative play. With the support of shape coding, they have been able to write short descriptive captions. In maths they have been challenged to write the "4 facts" of a single number bond. i.e. 1+4 = 5, 4+1 = 5, 5= 1+45=4+1. This has been very tricky and the children have used many different resources to support them. Year 2 have been writing fantastic letters giving excuses for why they are late for school; they have escaped volcanoes and avoided sharks in order to get to school. In maths they have been learning to count in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s as well as subitising numbers (the ability to instantly recognize the number of objects without actually counting them). In Topic KS1 has been exploring humans in space, first by creating a timeline of the famous space race between the US and the USSR and then by comparing astronauts Mae Jamison and Tim Peake. Year 2 were also challenged to write a fact file on one of these significant figures. What a busy week! Have a wonderful (hopefully dry) weekend!
