2. EARLY YEARS FOUNDATION STAGE

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is the stage of education for children from birth to the end of the Reception year.

It is based on the recognition that children learn best **through play and active learning.**

This is a very important stage as it helps your child get ready for school as well as preparing them for their future learning and successes. From when your child is born up until the age of 5, their early years experience should be happy, active, exciting, fun and secure; and support their development, care and learning needs.



MONITORING PROGRESS

We use **Tapestry**, an online Learning Journal, to record and evidence every child's achievements against the EYFS framework.

You will receive login details for Tapestry, which will allow you access to your child's records and gives you the opportunity to upload your own observations too.

Please return the consent form as soon as possible.



ATTAINMENT

We have parent consultation meetings in the autumn term and the spring term where the class teacher will meet with you and you have an opportunity to look at your child's work.

At the end of the summer term you will receive a written report. It will specify your child's attainment in all areas of learning. One of 3 levels will be assigned:

- At the expected level of development (expected)
- Not yet at the expected level of development (emerging)
- Beyond the expected level of development (exceeding)



3. THE SCHOOL DAY

Daily Activities:

- Morning Focus
- Maths and Phonics session
- Small focus group activities while other children are exploring indoors and outdoors (planned child-initiated activities)

Weekly Activities:

- Literacy and Maths focus for the week
- Reception topic activities
- One timetabled PE lesson per week

DROP-OFF and COLLECTION

Due to the continued need for social distancing, we will be implementing a staggered drop-off and collection timetable. Please stay within the time frame allocated.

THE FIRST FEW WEEKS

- Next week (w.c. Monday 7/9) the class will be split into 2 groups and the children will be attending 3 mornings.
- Group 1 will attend Monday, Tuesday and Friday Group 2 will attend Wednesday, Thursday and Friday On their first day the collection time is before lunch (11:45-12:00).
- On the other 2 days the collection time is after lunch (12:30-12:45).



THE FIRST FEW WEEKS

The third week (w.c. Monday 14/9) all children will be attending 5 days. You have the choice whether your child will attend full-time or part-time this week.

- If attending full-time they will go home at the end of the school day between 3:00-3:15pm.
- If attending part-time they will go home after lunch between 12:30-12:45



THE FIRST FEW WEEKS

Drop off and pick up will be from the front door until all children are full-time.

From the fourth week (w.c. Monday 21/9) your child will stay with us full-time and will need to be dropped of between 8:45-9:00am and collected between 3:00-3:15pm from the 5-bar gate.



WRAP AROUND CARE & AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS

We have a wide range of after school clubs and a breakfast club.

The breakfast club runs from 7:45-9:00am The after school clubs run from 3:15-4:15pm Monday – Messy Monkeys & Football Tuesday – French & Kickboxing Wednesday – Streetdance Thursday – Yoga & Tennis Friday – Tennis/Kickboxing

SCHOOL LUNCH

All children are provided with a school lunch through the Government Universal Infant School Meals Scheme. Initially the children will have lunch in their class group only, either outside, in the hall or in their classroom.

Reception will have lunch in the hall on Wednesdays.

Everyone is opted in. Initially the children will have sandwich lunches.

We will re-introduce hot lunches when it is available, feasible and safe to do so.

MEDICAL MATTERS

- Head lice are common! Please check regularly and treat as recommended.
- Only prescription medicines will be administered by staff. A form will need to be completed.
- Please speak to us if your child has any allergies or ongoing medical needs. A Health Care Plan will need to be implemented.



UNIFORM

- Please ensure that your child's name is in all items a clothing, including shoes and socks!
 You can use:
 - Iron on labels / sew in labels / sticky labels / laundry pen (available online or from the Uniform shop)
- This year we ask that the children come into school dressed in their PE kit on the day they have PE (Thursday) from Thursday 24th September.
- Please provide your child with a spare (PE) kit to be kept at school.

UNIFORM

Please ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for the weather:

- \checkmark a sun hat and sun screen applied in warm weather
- ✓ a raincoat or warm coat when it is cold or wet.
 ✓ a jumper or cardigan for the well-ventilated classroom

Your child will be taking part in lots of interesting and sometimes messy experiences, so may come home dirty! It is all part of the learning and fun!
