Linked with this, the children started making stained glass windows for the classroom. Lots of the children have their transition day next week and are getting quite excited about going to their next school. We have also been writing our own stories based on the book the Tunnel by Anthony Browne. In maths we have continued to learn about telling the time and have enjoyed revisiting symmetry with shapes. The children really enjoyed listening to Abby and taking part in the activities. Every morning this week we have been practicing country dancing and the children are amazing!
