Dear parents,

Late last night the government issued the following guidance for schools on maintaining educational provision:

If children can stay safely at home, they should, to limit the chance of the virus spreading. The government is asking parents to keep their children at home, wherever possible.

Schools remain safe places for children. Schools are, therefore, being asked to continue to provide care for a limited number of children. Dropmore Infant School will remain open for:

- children who are vulnerable;
- children whose parents are critical to the Covid-19 response.

Vulnerable children:

Vulnerable children include children who are supported by social care, those with safeguarding and welfare needs, including child in need plans, on child protection plans, 'looked after' children, young carers, disabled children and those with education, health and care (EHC) plans and other children facing social difficulties.

Key workers critical to the Covid-19 response:

The government has issued the following list of critical sectors below:

- Health and Social Care
- Education and Childcare
- Key Public Services
- Local and National Government
- Food and other necessary goods
- Public Safety and National Security
- Transport
- Utilities, Communication and Financial Services
