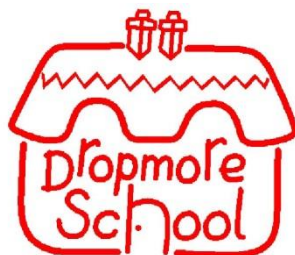

Welcome back to a new half term. I hope you all enjoyed your break from home schooling and had a restful week. The week started with the news that schools will be open to all pupils on Monday 8th March. We are looking forward to welcoming you all back. But there is still lots of lovely home learning to be enjoyed before 8th March.

This week Reception's topic has been 'healthy me'. The children have been looking at ways to keep their bodies healthy and have enjoyed a phonics workout and an active scavenger hunt during our live sessions. In phonics they have covered all of their phase 3 tricky words and nearly all of their phase 3 sounds! Year 1 have had a fantastic final week of poetry; hidden poems. Miss Rees and Miss Tolmie have been amazed by the creativity of the work produced, especially with the blackout poems that inspired some great themes and artistic opportunities. Year 1 also finished their Maths unit on Place Value within 50, with many of them making maths games and activities to further their own learning. As part of topic they have been able to share ways in which to stay healthy, discover the lifecycle of potatoes, make moving pictures and have started to learn the history of toys. Year 2 have started learning all about shape and have learnt some fancy words for their properties, like vertices. In English they have started listening and responding to stories about dragons. They have listened to 'The Dragon Machine' and have written their own sequels 'The Dragon Machine 2'. They had a fantastic toy scavenger hunt on Tuesday and loved finding different toys around their houses.
