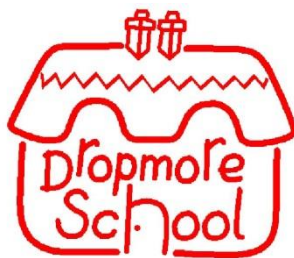


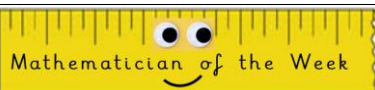

This week was our Science Week, in which we marked the re-opening of our science shed. Reception have thoroughly enjoyed taking part in lots of super Science activities this week and they especially enjoyed visiting the Science shed. There was lots of excitement on Wednesday when the children helped to create their very own worm home to keep in the classroom. They are now checking on the worm's progress each day and are enjoying watching them tunnel underground. The highlight of the week was most definitely spending time with our chicks and even having the opportunity to hold them. Year 1 have had a very exciting science week: On Monday they planted sweet peas and made a wormery; on Tuesday they examined (playdough) poo to identify local wildlife; on Wednesday they explored how far a sneeze could spread and were able to hold the chicks; on Thursday they looked for bug hotels around the school and flew their paper aeroplanes; and on Friday they tested how good surfaces were to scoot on and which material made the best hankie. On Friday they also took part in a class census to learn about the 2021 census. This week year 2 have taken part in many experiments including planting beans, speedy scooters, creating a wormery, dancing raisins and mystery cans. They have also started to create their own allotment to grow some vegetables to enjoy in the summer term. They have learnt about all the different scientific jobs you can have. They have also been learning about the census and how the data from the census helps us to look at the past. They were sad to see our three healthy chicks leave today and have really enjoyed watching them hatch and grow. They have visited them daily and will really miss this part of their school day. Next week our focus is going to be on enjoying books and stories. We will be celebrating World Book Day on Friday and staff are really looking forward to coming into school in their pyjamas!
